

SUB DISTRICT 14-N DRUG AWARENESS POSTER CONTEST RULES

This is the opportunity for the Lions of Sub District 14-N to penetrate the home and school on the drug issue. All clubs should have this project as one of their top priorities.

1. All posters must be 12" x 18". Larger or smaller posters will not be judged on the District level.
2. Each local club needs to set up their own criteria and do their own judging. Clubs may have as many winners giving whatever awards they choose, enter your best posters to the District for judging. For example, if you have five (5) 4th grade classrooms participating, you may enter only five (5) posters to be judged at the District level, but they could all be from one classroom.
3. The winning posters from each 4th grade classroom from the local clubs need to be in the hands of the Lion representing the committee in each county and as listed in the District Governor's directory, so they can be judged by the Honor Roll of Lions. You will be notified of this date in March when it is set. It is good to have the posters in your hands by the end of February.
4. Posters need to be on the drug and alcohol awareness theme and may include alcohol, cigarettes, beer, or drugs such as cocaine, marijuana, etc., or they may include all of the above.
5. The District will have the following awards: 1st Place - \$200.00 Savings Bond; 2nd Place - \$100.00 Savings Bond; 3rd Place - \$75.00 Savings Bond; 4th Place - \$50.00 Savings Bond; and 15 Honorable mention awards of \$10.00 cash each.
6. Each poster must have the following on the back: student's name, school, room number, teacher's name, and the sponsoring Lions Club's name. If a student wins a Savings Bond, the sponsoring Lions Club will be contacted to obtain the student's Social Security Number.
7. Only 4th grade students are eligible for the contest.
8. District winning posters will be displayed at the Spring Convention and it will be the responsibility of each individual club to pick up its winners after the Convention. Posters taken for judging by the Honor Roll of Lions that are not winners need to be returned to each club by the person who brought them for judging.
9. Each Club should arrange to have their posters displayed in their community.
10. Clubs should send thank you letters to teachers and principals who participated and remind them you will be in contact again next year.
11. Clubs should attempt to present awards in the classrooms if at all possible.
