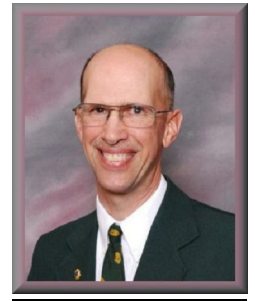

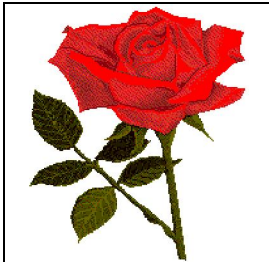

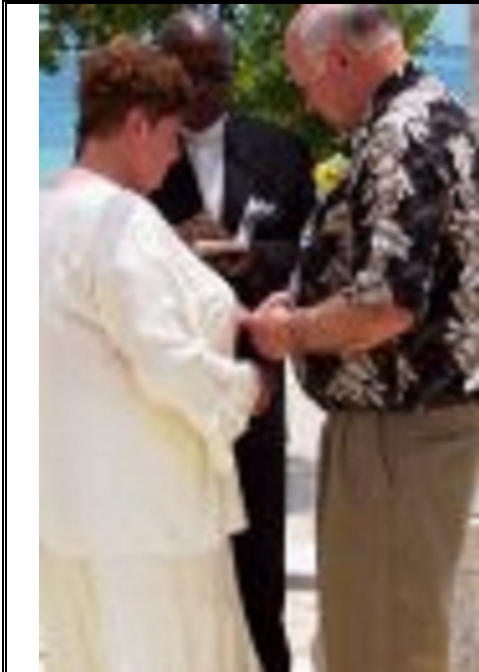

**2011 PENNSYLVANIA LIONS STATE CONVENTION
HOSTED BY DISTRICT 14-N**

Fellow Lions, Lionesses and Leos,

District 14-N will be hosting the 88th Annual Pennsylvania Lions State Convention to be held at the Marriott Inn in Cranberry Township, PA on May 19-22, 2011. We last hosted our state convention in Pittsburgh in 1993. What makes this convention such a huge undertaking, is that we will be hosting the August, 2010 State Council Meeting at the same location. Hosting both events, in the same fiscal year will be a challenge to our district.

Hosting the state convention requires the help of as many Lions, Lionesses and Leos as possible. What does this mean to you and your respective club?

- Each of you is asked to register (\$12.50 fee) for the 2011 convention. Your registration permits you to attend seminars, banquets, hospitality night, tours, etc.
- You can volunteer some of your time to serve on committees such as registration, certification, basket raffle, information desk, sergeant at arms, necrology, etc.
- Each club should have their 2011-2012 officers attend the state run officers' training seminar and the model luncheon, to be held on Friday morning as possible. May I suggest that the club pick up the cost of their new officers' registration fee.
- Every District 14-N Club will be asked to purchase a basket (approximate value of \$50 each) for both the August State Council Meeting and the May State Convention. The proceeds from these raffles help defray the cost of hosting these events. PDG Anna Marie Larkin will be chairing this committee for both events.
- Each member will be asked to place a patron ad (\$5 per line) which will be placed in the program booklet which is being chaired by Lion Bill Laughner. Again, this helps defray the cost of printing.
- Each club will be asked to consider placing an ad in the convention booklet. Again, this helps defray the printing costs. In your ad, you may want to list your 2011-2012 officers along with your general membership. You may also highlight your Melvin Jones and/or Pennsylvania Lions Fellows.
- If you are a business owner, you may want to place an ad in the program booklet. (Ad forms will be mailed to each club in early December 2010)

The 2011 State Convention Committee looks forward to the support of the Lions, Lionesses and Leos of District 14-N and their respective clubs.
