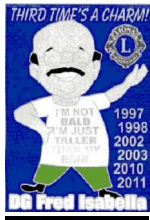

In this issue of our newsletter, you will find my Visitation schedule for all the Lions Clubs. If there is a conflict or a mistake on my part, please notify me ASAP.

The following are my Goals for this year: Let's bring back fun in our clubs.

Increase District membership above 1,250. We will accomplish some of this by starting two new clubs. With this I am directing our Extension Chairperson to work on starting one (1) new club by November 2010 and one (1) new club by May 2011. I am, also, directing that our Membership Chairperson continue his drive to help each club in our District to get new members. Our Retention Chairperson will help all clubs before they drop a member, if at all possible. Our clubs should support our Leadership Chairperson in his attempts to train our club officers. Properly trained officers will always help clubs. Our Orientation Chairperson will aid each club with orientation training materials and support when requested. The Family and Women's Chairperson will coordinate the drive to bring more families and women into our clubs.

100% club participation in the District Governor's projects. This is important so we can help all our projects. I realize \$20 a member is high, but the importance of these projects is very strong.

Have club secretaries send to International their MMR (monthly membership report) and their activities report. These are very important, the membership information so that the club can be charged the correct amount of dues and the activity report so International can use this in doing their Public Relations Campaigns.

Encourage clubs to identify potential leaders who could be active at the District level...Encourage Leos who have graduated to become Lions...Start three new Leo clubs...Have every club represented at the cabinet meetings and the Fall and Spring Rallies...Promote Lionism in each club's area through PR.

I can only accomplish my Goals with all of your help. I realize I am asking a lot from our various Chairpersons, but they can't do it alone either, we need support from all Lions. In my last term as DG, I was forced to close several clubs. It appears that with the new rules recently put into effect by International, I may be FORCED to close Clubs that owe International monies over a specified time. The amounts owed would be either \$20 a member or \$1,000 a club whichever is the least. We currently have a club that is on the border.
