



Hello, just thought I'd let you know I'm back. You probably thought you were rid of me, but like a bad penny, I'll keep showing up. This time not as the District Governor, but as the "Global Service Team Coordinator" for District 14N.

It will be my responsibility to encourage the clubs in 14N to report their service projects. I'll do my best to remind you how important it is to report what you do. I have always contended if people don't know what you do, people don't know what you do.

Tough to build brand recognition if you don't let anybody know what your brand does. We are the best service organization in the world! Let's let people know. We are the Lions. I wear Lions stuff 90% of the time I'm out, hoping someone will ask, "What are the Lions?" When Lynn or my friend Paul hear that, they just bow and shake their heads, knowing I'm loaded with information I can give them, and not ashamed to give it. I'm proud to be a Lion.

A reason to report what your Lions club does is we want to know what you're doing, it's recorded and added with the other 47,000 club's reports to compile a running total of the lives we touch, what the Lion's do to help generate goodwill.

Another important reason to report what we do, is we cooperate with other non-profits in accomplishing our goals around the world. We are the boots on the ground for some of these organizations. We are one of the most respected organizations in the world, and with over 47,000 clubs, in 210 countries, very

often we're the first on the scene of emergencies. Where there's a need there's a Lion.

We have helped distribute over 440 million measles vaccines worldwide. We would never have been able to do this without the help of our more affluent partners. And the way we get the help of these affluent partners is to show them we are worthy of their money. And the way we do that is by letting them know how many lives we have touched. Last year we touched the lives of 495 million people, and that was with less than 60% of the clubs reporting. Imagine if we all reported? As an organization we hope to reach out to 1 BILLION people by 2027.

I received a report the other day saying District 14N had 18 clubs out of 36 that have not reported a service activity in over 4 months. That's half of our clubs! Shame, Shame. That's a crapload of non reporting. I know most of you have done something in the last four months, try to get in the habit of reporting as you go. Once you do it a few times it becomes easy and it's nice to look and see how much you've done. I understand a lot of clubs shut down for Summer, so that would be a problem, but we're all up and running now, so please if you do something enter it in MYLION. I'm going to say it takes less than 5 minutes to enter your information, and it "don't cost nuthin".

I'm here to help the best I can, so if you have a problem figuring out how to enter info, call me, **724-944-1869**, while you're on the computer and we can work through it together, it really isn't hard, and it helps so much.

Also, if you need help with a project feel free to reach out to me and see what I'm doing. You can also reach out to nearby clubs for help. We need to start working together more and more.

Take care and I look forward to working with you all again. Well maybe not all, but I'll fake it.




