
President Sheehan certainly has lived up to his motto of "Together we Can. Together we will", and he does it in a powerful way.

BAKED ORZO WITH SHRIMP

SERVES 6 DIABETIC FRIENDLY

- 1 medium yellow onion, finely chopped
- 3 garlic cloves, minced
- ¹/₂ tsp. dried oregano, crumbled
- ¹/₄ tsp. hot red pepper flakes (optional)
- 2 Tbsp. extra virgin olive oil
- ¹/₂ cup dry white wine
- 1 (28-36 oz.) can crushed tomatoes
- 1 tsp. salt
- 2 lbs. raw shrimp, shelled and deveined 1 lb. orzo (regular or whole wheat)
- ½ cup pitted Kalamata olives, chopped
- 2 cups crumbled feta cheese

Preheat oven to 425 degrees.

Cook the onions, garlic, oregano and red pepper flakes in 1 Tbsp. olive oil in a 4 quart heavy pot over medium-high heat, stirring, until the onion is softened, about 3 minutes. Stir in the wine, tomatoes and salt, then reduce the heat and simmer, stirring frequently, until slightly thickened, about 8 minutes. Stir the shrimp into the sauce and simmer, stirring occasionally, until the shrimp are cooked through, about 3 minutes.

While the sauce and shrimp are cooking, cook the orzo in a 6 quart pot of boiling salted water until al dente. Reserve ½ cup of the cooking water, then drain the orzo. Return the orzo to the pot and toss with the remaining tablespoon of olive oil. Stir in the sauce with shrimp and the reserved ½ cup of pasta water, then add the olives, and salt and pepper to taste.

Spoon half of the pasta into an oiled 13" x 9" x 2" glass baking dish. Sprinkle with half of the feta. Top with the remaining pasta, then sprinkle with the remaining feta cheese. Bake in the middle of the oven uncovered, until the cheese is slightly melted and the pasta is heated through, about 15 minutes.




